

# ALFRED N. KOPLIN

**Alfred N. Koplin** is a business leader and local philanthropist who has been a tremendous supporter of Elmhurst University, both as a donor and as a member of the Board of Trustees for nearly 40 years.

As president of Alfred N. Koplin, Inc., in Hinsdale, Koplin has been a successful real estate investor who literally built his business from the ground up. In the 1950s, after serving in the military for a number of years, Koplin and his wife, Jean, began building homes throughout the western suburbs of Chicago.

In 1966, they created the Hinsdale Management Corporation, a commercial real estate and property management company, to manage the more than 300 properties they had built. Over the next five decades, the Koplins built Hinsdale Management Corporation into a real estate portfolio that manages more than one million square feet of property.

Koplin has served on the Elmhurst University Board of Trustees since 1981 and has been a generous donor to the University and to the community at large. Not only has he invested a significant amount of his and Jean Koplin's wealth into the University, but he also has challenged others to raise their level of giving. In 2017, he created and championed his own "Koplin Challenge," where he promised to match up to \$200,000 of what was raised. His challenge raised more than \$211,000 in additional funds from Trustees alone.

His philanthropic gifts to Elmhurst University have supported faculty endeavors, student scholarships and curriculum development. In recognition of his many years of service, Elmhurst University awarded Koplin an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters on May 30, 2015.

ZACHARY HUND '10 Young Alumni Award

**Zachary Hund '10** is an award-winning chemistry teacher at the University of Chicago Laboratory Schools who has used his passion for teaching to create new programs and engage more students, especially women, in the study of advanced chemistry.

For the past few years, Hund also has been an adjunct faculty member at Elmhurst teaching chemistry.

A Senior of the Year finalist at Elmhurst, Hund graduated early, in 2010, and attended the University of Chicago for graduate school in physical chemistry, where he earned his master's degree and Ph.D., as well as a University Teaching Certificate.

While successful at publishing his research at UChicago, Hund's passion lay in teaching. He is in his sixth year as a chemistry teacher at the University of Chicago Laboratory Schools, where he has boosted enrollment in advanced chemistry from 10 students (20 percent female) to almost 60 (about 50 percent female). Hund also mentors UChicago graduate students interested in K-12 education, and has received numerous honors and awards for service, teaching and research. This past spring, the 20-member science department selected Hund as their new chair.

# JEANNE BURDA '82

Distinguished Service to Alma Mater Award

**Jeanne Burda '82** is a member of the Elmhurst University nursing faculty and an active alumna whose efforts have significantly enhanced nursing alumni engagement with the University.

As a lecturer in the Department of Nursing and Health Sciences, Burda specializes in family health, specifically maternal-neonatal care. She also has a focus in community health nursing, and encourages students to expand their worldview of maternity nursing and improving health care outcomes. Burda cowrote the grant that started the White Coat Ceremony, which celebrates nursing students when they begin their clinical practice. She received her BSN from Elmhurst University and her MSN from Loyola University.

Burda is a board member of the Elmhurst University Alumni Association, as well as the nursing department's alumni coordinator. During her tenure, the number of nursing alumni at Homecoming has increased, as has the size of the nursing department's alumni database.

Burda's nomination letter says her teaching exemplifies the Elmhurst University mission because it inspires intellectual and personal growth in her students, and prepares them for meaningful and ethical contributions to a diverse, global society.

Distinguished Service to

Distinguished Service to Society Award

**Robert Carter Olson '83** is a superior court judge in Arizona who has spent a distinguished career in public service as a judge, prosecutor, public administrator and civic leader.

Serving on the Superior Court bench in Pinal County, Ariz., Olson began his career with the county in 1990, when he joined the County Attorney's Office as a criminal prosecutor. He would go on to serve more than 11 years as the elected county attorney before his first appointment to the Superior Court in 2007. He also has served as a commissioner, and was reappointed to the Superior Court in 2018.

Beyond judicial service, Olson served on the Board of Trustees of the Public Safety Personnel Retirement System, a multi-billion dollar pension system that covers police, firefighters, elected officials, judges, and corrections officers. He also has received numerous awards for his civic and professional activities.

An Honors Program student at Elmhurst, Olson graduated in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in public accounting.



Elmhurst University awards the Founders Medal to individuals who have made outstanding contributions in philanthropic or personal service to the University's mission. Established in 1978, the Founders Medal is one of the University's highest honors.

### ALUMNI MERIT AWARDS

The Alumni Merit Awards were established in 1962 by the Alumni Association of Elmhurst University. These awards serve as a means of annually recognizing three outstanding alumni who provide excellent contributions to society and the University.
